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NEW ZEALAND WINE REGIONS





The Auckland wine region is located around New Zealand's largest city, Auckland, on the North Island of New Zealand. Warm, subtropical climate with high humidity and rainfall. The high temperatures help with the cultivation of slow-ripening grape varieties. Due to the high rainfall, disease control is a challenge.

Most of Auckland's vineyards are located on heavy clay soil, which naturally often accumulates water. The right location is therefore essential to produce very good wines. Chardonnay ripens early enough in Auckland to produce very good wine. Grapes that ripen relatively late (such as Cabernet Sauvignon) can pose a challenge in cooler years.

Waiheke Island is part of the Auckland wine region. Waiheke differs from the rest of the wine region due to its island location. It is drier, somewhat sunnier and slightly warmer. Due to the long, mild seasons with higher average temperatures and more hours of sunshine than most other regions in New Zealand, later ripening grape varieties can also be cultivated.

Waiheke Island lies on the same latitude as Australia's Cabernet capital Coonawarra. Accordingly, Waiheke produces outstanding, powerful red wines such as Syrah and Bordeaux-style red cuvées.

Alongside Hawke's Bay, Waiheke Island is the top producer of these wines in New Zealand.



MAN O' WAR

Perfect natural conditions together with high winemaking skills attribute to the success of Man O'War wines. Dramatic scenery and panoramic views are all around when you visit the island home of the Man O'War vineyards.

It was along this coastline that Captain James Cook came to anchor during his first voyage around the islands of New Zealand in 1769. Upon sighting the ancient stands of magnificent Kauri trees ashore, Cook noted in his journals that they would make ideal masts for the Man O' War warships of the Royal Navy. Thus the name Man O' War was bestowed upon this unique land.

Over two hundred years after Cook first sighted Man O' War, the Spencer family was convinced that world class wine could be grown here. Throwing caution to the wind the first vines were planted in 1993. Today Man O' War is still a family business and consists of 60 ha of vines planted in 76 individual hillside blocks, each with a distinct soil profile and microclimate.

Every single block bears the footprints, and sometimes the names, of those who transformed Man O' War's rugged hillsides into a spectacular patchwork of vines. Each block has been meticulously designed with different rootstocks, clones and planting densities to best match the specific terroir on offer. Each small parcel of vines is carefully tended and harvested by hand, then vinified separately, fusing classic Old World techniques with innovative New World ideas.

Stonyridge is one of the most famous New Zealand wineries with a worldwide following. The small, exquisite winery from yoga lover Stephen White has a tiny small production from its 6 ha vineyard. The **Bordeaux Style Blend Larose** is one of the best in the world and has **beaten top French wines like Château Lafite in blind tastings**.

Stonyridge Vineyard is the ongoing dream of owner Stephen White. In 1981 Stephen returned to New Zealand after sailing a Whitbread Round the World Yacht Race, skippering yachts in the Mediterranean and Caribbean, and working at wineries in France, California and Italy.

Stonyridge is located at the same relative latitude as the southern tip of Sicily. Stonyridge is located in a gently north-facing valley, 1 km from both Onetangi Beach to the north and Putiki Bay to the south. It is sheltered from the cold southwesterly winds by Stonyridge, a long ridge running from one coast to the other.

A nearby rock quarry gives an indication of the soil type. The soil is a poor low-fertility Waitemata clay saturated with nodules of magnesium, manganese, and iron oxides. Magnesium is the central molecule of chlorophyll, essential for photosynthesis, much loved by grape vines and so often deficient in NZ soils. With the 1993 vintage, Stonyridge made the first Bordeaux five blend in the „New World“. In 2000, an elite French sommelier team put Stonyridge Larose 1996 as first equal with Chateau Petrus, Lafite Rothschild, Latour and Cheval Blanc in Grandes vins rouge du Monde (Les Editions du Bottin Gourmand).

HAWKE'S BAY



Hawke's Bay is considered the oldest wine-growing region in New Zealand, where the first wine was grown as early as 1851. It is the second largest wine-growing region in the country after Marlborough with an area of 1.4 million hectares, which is about a quarter of the size of Napa or Saint-Émilion. Around 10% of New Zealand's total wine production comes from this region.

Hawke's Bay is one of the sunniest areas in the country. It is warmer than New Zealand's most famous region, Marlborough, which lies 300 kilometres further south. Parts of Hawke's Bay are warmer than Burgundy. Other districts are cooler than Bordeaux. The driest time of the year is usually spring and early summer. These dry periods (less than 1 mm of rain a day for at least 15 days) occur on average three times a year. At least one drought (without measurable rain for at least 15 days) can also be expected.

Over thousands of years, 4 major rivers have flowed through Hawke's Bay, forming valleys and terraces and creating over 25 different soil types: from clay to limestone to sand and free-flowing gravel and red metal. The elevation in Hawke's Bay ranges from sea level to several hundred metres inland. Warm, north-facing slopes, river valleys and terraces as well as coastal areas provide a variety of growing sites suitable for a wide range of grape varieties.

The region is known for its Cabernet cuvées, Syrahs and Chardonnays. Rotundon, a chemical compound responsible for the pepper flavour, has a particularly high concentration in the Hawke's Bay Syrah.



BILANCIA

Bilancia is a small Hawke's Bay producer of exceptional Chardonnay and Syrah. It is the label of husband-and-wife winemakers Lorraine Leheny and Warren Gibson and was established in 1997 when Lorraine and Warren returned to New Zealand from winemaking overseas. The first wines were released in mid 1998.

The word Bilancia (be-larn-cha) means, in Italian, balance, equilibrium and harmony. These terms have obvious connections with wine and winemaking, but also, Bilancia is the Italian word for the Zodiac sign Libra which the two winemakers were born under. Warren worked in Southern Italy for a number of harvests and the name came to him whilst reading his Horoscope in the Italian newspaper! The philosophy of balance, equilibrium and harmony is something that is carried through all aspects of the winemaking.

The viticultural central point for Bilancia is the 6 hectares (15 acres) of land covering the front and back of Roys Hill (west of Hastings on State Highway 50) where, planted only on the North - Northwest facing slope is the vineyard known as la collina (col-ee-na), which is Italian for "the hill". The upper most slopes and terraces are planted to Syrah whilst the lower gently rising land and gravels flat is planted to Chardonnay with eight rows of Viognier, Marsanne and Roussanne of the edge of the gravels. All fruit is sourced from Hawke's Bay vineyards: Syrah from la collina and Roys Hill, Chardonnay from la collina (Tiratore), Roys Hill and Otane (Central Hawke's Bay).

PARITUA

Boutique, bespoke wines from the oldest gravels in Hawke's Bay. The winery lies in the heart of the acclaimed Bridge Pa Triangle wine region of Hawke's Bay, on New Zealand's North Island.

The vines were planted in 2003 and with 53 hectares planted in three phases: seventy percent is devoted to red varieties – Cabernet Sauvignon, Syrah, Merlot, Cabernet Franc, Malbec – with Sauvignon Blanc and Chardonnay completing the picture. Paritua's vineyard enjoys stony, free draining soils, long summers and crisp winters, which combine to produce exceptional quality grapes to craft the wines. These are boutique, bespoke wines from the oldest gravels in Hawke's Bay. The chief winemaker of the winery is Jason Stent. He has been with Paritua for 14 years. His passion is to create wines that respect the place and terroir where the vine grows. The flagship wine "21·12" is only produced in the best vintages.

The name Paritua is a tribute to the Paritua Stream, which meanders gently through the vineyard. Paritua means the meandering stream above the ancient river. The vineyard is planted over the historical riverbed of the nearby Ngaruroro River which flowed through pre the 1860s earthquake. It is a name that also acknowledges the connection with the land and the people of New Zealand.

TE MATA ESTATE

Established in 1896, Te Mata Estate remains family owned, producing internationally recognized wines exclusively from its Hawke's Bay vineyards. Te Mata has New Zealand's oldest working vineyards of chardonnay and cabernet.

Te Mata Estate was originally part of Te Mata Station, a large pastoral land-holding established by English immigrant, John Chambers, in 1854. A homestead and stables were built on the property in the early 1870's.

After returning from France, John Chamber's third son, Bernard, had the idea to plant vineyards on the north-facing hills around Havelock North. In 1892, Bernard Chambers planted vines on three parcels of hillside land above the homestead and began converting the original stables to ferment and mature these first Te Mata Estate Wines. Today, Te Mata Estate still uses those same three vineyards.

The Chambers family sold the property in 1919. Te Mata Vineyards was established and the property had two other owners until it was acquired by the Buck and Morris families in 1974 – the two families behind the modern interpretation of this historic New Zealand estate. 165ha is planted across four Hawke's Bay sub-regions. Te Mata was New Zealand's first estate with winery and vineyards accredited as Sustainable Winegrowing NZ.

The Mata is a specialist in full-bodied red wines. Red wines make 70% of the production. The most famous wines is the Coleraine, which is a New Zealand icon wine.

WAIRARAPA _ MARTINBOROUGH



Martinborough is the jewel of the Wairarapa wine region in the south of the North Island. The small wine village is just under an hour away from New Zealand's capital Wellington. It is tranquil here. There is not a single traffic light, just a hotel, a grocery shop and a golf course. The picture is characterised by almost 20 mostly small wineries, all a stone's throw from each other. Among them are some of New Zealand's best-known wineries.

Wairarapa is located on New Zealand's North Island and is on the same level as Marlborough on the South Island.

The Wairarapa region accounts for only 3% of New Zealand's vineyards and 1% of its wine production. You will look in vain for large corporations here. There are 3 sub-regions: Martinborough, Gladstone and Masterton.

Wairarapa (Maori for 'sparkling water') can easily be confused with Waipara (Maori for 'muddy water'). The latter region is located on the South Island of New Zealand, north of Christchurch.



ATA RANGI

When Clive Paton sold his dairy herd in 1980 to buy five barren hectares near the small farming town of Martinborough to grow Pinot Noir, it was considered crazy. But this courage paid off: Ata Rangi, which means 'dawn' or 'new beginning' in the Māori language, is now synonymous with some of New Zealand's most elegant and long-lived Pinot Noirs. The flagship wine Ata Rangi Martinborough Pinot Noir was awarded the title 'Grand Cru of New Zealand (Tipuranga Teitei o Aotearoa)' in 2010.

Since these bold beginnings, Ata Rangi now cultivates around 32 hectares on the Martinborough Terrace, a gravelly terrace that forms the heart of the region. In addition to Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, Sauvignon Blanc, Pinot Gris, Riesling, Syrah, Merlot, Malbec and Cabernet Franc also thrive here. Thanks to the natural philosophy, which emphasises biodiversity and sustainable care, the vines bring the character of the region into the bottle with particular intensity.

Ata Rangi is not only passionate about artisanal winemaking, but also about treating nature with respect. The team strengthens the health of the vines and promotes life in the soil through targeted planting and the use of home-made compost mixtures made from grape skins, seaweed and wild plants. From pruning in winter to harvesting in autumn - every job here is done with dedication and by hand. The family trio Clive Paton, his wife Phyll Pattie and his sister Alison Paton are still the owners of Ata Rangi today.

DRY RIVER

Dry River is one of the pioneers in Martinborough and one of New Zealand's cult brands. It was established 1979 by Dr Neil and Dawn McCallum. The first wines were bottled in 1984 and Dry River has since developed a reputation as one of New Zealand's most iconic pioneering wineries. The wines are largely sold by mail order and are not widely available through the retail trade. The winery is best known for **their small volumes of intense and mostly age-worthy wines all of which deserve iconic status.**

„Nature. Nurture. Knowledge.“ – this is the mantra of the winery. Fine wine is a combination of the characteristics of the Earth, and a unique knowledge of how to get the best out of this special place they call home.

Now led by winemaker Wilco Lam, Dry River achieves impressive concentration in all its reds by maintaining low yields and manipulating the vine canopy to expose the fruit to sunlight early in the ripening season.

The name Dry River was that of one of the earliest South Wairarapa sheep stations (around 1877).

Palliser Estate is well established as a leading winery in the ultra premium grape-growing region of Martinborough. Martinborough's fertile and free-draining soil was created over the course of 20,000 years, as the Ruamahanga River and its contributing rivers exposed stony sub-soils, built up layers of alluvial river terraces and cast its silty river loam across the landscape. The vineyard has spread across **72 hectares** that produces predominantly Pinot Noir and Sauvignon Blanc, as well as Chardonnay, Pinot Gris and Riesling.

To continue to produce these great wines, Palliser puts a lot of effort to protect the environment. Excellent soil to produce excellent wines is only possible in a healthy, fertile environment. As a result, Palliser estate has developed a sustainable approach to the land. They closely monitor and minimise all the impacts the winery has on the environment – from the sprays applied in the vineyard to all the packaging materials used. In 2009, they **were the first CEMARS certified winery in the world**.

Palliser Estate is part of the Family of Twelve. The Family of Twelve is a fraternity of twelve of New Zealand's most prestigious and enduring artisanal wineries.

Nelson is a wine region with many family-run boutique wineries. German emigrants planted the first vines in the middle of the 19th century.

Modern wine production began in the 1970s. The Neudorf winery is one of the two pioneers in the region from this period. Nelson has two sub-regions - Moutere Hills and Waimea Plains. Nelson's location provides a balanced, mild and sunny climate. Mountain ranges to the west, south and east protect it from extreme weather and strong winds; combined with its proximity to the sea, this results in milder temperatures than other regions of the South Island, reducing the risk of frost. Nelson is regularly the sunniest region in New Zealand, and the strong diurnal variations help to emphasise the character of the grape varieties. Many hours of sunshine and a long growing season make for wonderfully clear grape flavours.

Nelson is the eighth largest wine-growing region in New Zealand and is located in the north of the South Island in the Waimea Plain. It is only separated from Marlborough by a mountain range, which protects the region from the vagaries of the weather and ensures a mild and temperate climate.

The light and sandy clay soils guarantee excellent harvests. The high clay content ensures a higher water storage capacity than is the case with the soils in Marlborough.

Brightwater Gravels is accredited 100% sustainable. Sheep are used for grass and weed control. High sunshine hours and the cool, clear nights provide a slow ripening period that helps to retain the vibrant varietal flavours.

Winemaker Trudy Sheild creates the wines and brings in her experience of creating award-winning wines. The wines are carefully crafted, balanced, and consistently surprise with their complex tones, and polished finish. In addition, she creates new wines under the label SHEILD.

Marlborough liegt im Nordosten der Südinsel Neuseelands. Die langgezogene Bergkette im Westen sorgt für einen natürlichen Regenschutz. Marlborough hat eines der sonnigsten und wärmsten Klimas in Neuseeland.

An die 2400 Sonnenstunden im Jahr bei einem durchschnittlichen Niederschlag von 652 mm sind ideal für den Weinanbau. Zudem spielt die Lage der Weinregion direkt am Meer eine große Rolle. Sonnige, aber mit ca. 24°C nicht zu heiße Tage und durch die abendlichen Seebrisen bis zu 10°C kühlere Nächte schaffen das ideale Klima für eine langsame Reifeperiode der Trauben.

Diese Temperaturschwankungen sorgen dafür, dass die Trauben die frischen, lebhaften Fruchtcharaktere beibehalten. Sie bringen die knackigen Kräutercharakteristika des Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc hervor und sorgen für die Farbentwicklung der Haut des Marlborough Pinot Noir.

Die unterschiedlichen Bodentypen von Marlborough sorgen für unterschiedliche Weine und somit für Vielfalt.

At the boutique winery in the Wairau Valley, the Framingham team crafts expressive, individual small batch wines with new world purity and old world complexity. The long-serving only sources fruit from the Wairau Valley, from both their own vineyard and carefully selected grower sites nearby.

The Framingham Rieslings are arguably the best in the country, the reputation cemented by a number of annual releases. Framingham does it all so well with Riesling, and notably with the likes of the 'Classic', 'Select' and 'Noble', which are recognised consistently as among the country's best in classical styles. The wines from their 30+ year old vines show off the estate's stony terroir in a distinctly Germanic fashion.

Nevertheless, Framingham is first and foremost a Marlborough Sauvignon Blanc producer. The vast majority of its annual 23,000 – 25,000 case production is dedicated to that variety. The Sauvignon Blanc is distinctly Marlborough with a mineral twist, crafted from many different batches from several diverse Wairau Valley sites.

Framingham is carefully pushing the boundaries in style, and the Framingham label is increasingly showing points of difference from mainstream Marlborough.

LAWSON'S DRY HILLS

Lawson's Dry Hills celebrated 30 years of winegrowing in 2021, and it is well-established as one of Marlborough's stalwart producers with a wonderful reputation for the quality of its wines, especially with Sauvignon Blanc and the aromatic varieties. The original company vineyard was planted in 1982 by Ross and Barbara Lawson, who launched the Lawson's Dry Hills label some ten years later, in 1992. Ross and Barbara Lawson are one of the pioneers in the New Zealand wine scene.

Their first vintage included Gewürztraminer. It was just fifteen tons and was managed by Ross from the old red tin shed on the property, which is still standing and forms part of the winery cellar door. Sadly, Ross passed away in February 2009. The company is now run by general manager and director Sion Barnsley, his family being shareholders from the start.

The team around winemaker Marcus Wright shows an open-mindedness with respect to winemaking styles. Marcus has been in the company since 2001. Lawson's Dry Hills is part of the Family of Twelve. The Family of Twelve is a fraternity of twelve of New Zealand's most prestigious and enduring artisanal wineries.

Lawson's Dry Hills has achieved carbon zero status having met the requirements of ISO14064 and received accreditation from Toitu. The winery is the only New Zealand wine producer to be certified with both ISO14001 and ISO14064. Lawson's Dry Hills was awarded winner of the wine industry category at the 2021 Cawthron Marlborough Environment Awards.

The primary emphasis for all of Mahi's wines is texture, aiming for wines that give real palate satisfaction.

Since the first vintage in 2001 they have built together a group of growers who are committed to their land and to the wines that come from it.

The No.1 winery and vineyards are located in the Wairau Valley in Marlborough. The combination of soils and climate, which is consistent every year, reminds Daniel of Champagne in its best vintages.

The name Spy Valley derived its name from the presence of an international satellite base located just down the road from the estate - **Marlborough's very own spy base**.

Founder and owner of te Pā, Haysley MacDonald traces his ancestry back to the early Māori settlers who landed on Wairau Bar 800 years ago. Since releasing its first vintage Sauvignon Blanc in 2011, the te Pā brand has grown to represent impeccable quality, true heritage and authenticity, and a drive to create new growth from ancient lands. Today, te Pā is rapidly growing internationally and now owning around 500ha across Marlborough.

Haysley is the driving force behind the TUKU collective. TUKU is the world's first Māori winemakers collective, bringing together awarded Māori wine companies based on their shared values of the land, family and hospitality, together offering a wide range of premium varietals from the most famous wine growing regions of Aotearoa New Zealand.

TE WHARE RA (TWR)

Te Whare Ra (TWR), the „house in the sun“, is the oldest boutique winery in Marlborough. Established 1979 in Renwick, it has the oldest Riesling, Chardonnay and Gewürztraminer vines in Marlborough.

In 2003, TWR was purchased by the husband and wife winemaker team Anna and Jason Flowerday. Anna is a 6th generation winegrower from McLaren Vale in Australia and Jason is a 3rd generation kiwi winegrower with both parents and grandparents in the NZ wine industry.

Their aim is to grow great quality fruit which is balanced in all its components, and which requires minimal winemaking intervention once they get it in the winery. This means a cropping level which is strictly controlled. Anna and Jason do selective crop thinning at several key times during the growing season across all varieties, as well as very detailed canopy management.

There also is a big focus on soil health in the management of their 11ha vineyard. This is achieved through old school farming, composting, biodynamic preparations, selected mixed grasses in mid rows and looking after bees and biodiversity.

TWR is considered to be one of the prime producers of quality wines in Marlborough.

Central Otago in New Zealand is no ordinary wine growing region. As the southernmost wine region in the world, located at 45 degrees south latitude, and with an altitude of 200 to 450 metres above sea level, it is a truly unique place to grow wine. Central Otago is a region of climatic extremes - the highest (38.7°C) and lowest (-21.6°C) temperatures have been recorded in Central Otago. It is assumed that the strong temperature fluctuations between day and night (11 to 15 °C in the valleys) increase the aroma and colour intensity of the grapes. Summers are generally hot (with temperatures often well above 30-35 °C), dry and short. Autumn is cool and dry, with clear, cold nights, and winters are icy, with snow covering the vines.

But its uniqueness is not limited to geographical features. The centrepiece of Central Otago is undoubtedly the Pinot Noir. Experts consider this region to be one of the best in the world for this fine wine. The continental climate brings with it extreme temperature fluctuations: from hot, dry summers to icy, snow-covered winters. These conditions shape the character of the grapes, giving them aroma and colour intensity.

The soils are as diverse as the land itself. From slate and clay soils to gravel and sand, the region offers a wide range of soil types. This diversity, coupled with stony subsoils that promote good drainage, creates optimal conditions for viticulture. Another outstanding feature of Central Otago is the low humidity, which reduces the risk of fungal diseases and favours viticulture.



QUARTZ REEF

Austrian-born Rudi Bauer is one of New Zealand's premier winemakers and has been **a force in New Zealand and international wine growing for more than three decades.**

Rudi Bauer is a two-time winner of the New Zealand Winemaker of the Year award. Rudi arrived in New Zealand in 1985 with degrees in viticulture and winemaking, joining New Zealand's oldest winery, Mission Estate, as assistant winemaker.

While Central Otago may be most famous today for its dramatic scenery portrayed in the Lord of the Rings movies, Rudi is helping ensure it is equally famous for its sparkling wines and Pinot Noir. **In 1989, he became Rippon Vineyard's first certified winemaker. The pinot noirs he created there sparked a pinot-revolution** and led to an increase of wineries in the region. In 1990, Rudi made **New Zealand's first sparkling base wine in Central Otago.** He was the first to see the huge potential that the sub-region of Bendigo offers for outstanding wines.

Rudi founded his own winery Quartz Reef in 1996. Quartz Reef produces sparkling and still wines of both finesse and power.

Quartz Reef also produces one of the country's, and certainly one of Central Otago's, best méthode sparkling wines. – The REAL Review

RIPPON

The stunningly beautiful Rippon Vineyard is situated on the shores of Lake Wanaka, with views across the lake to Ruby Island and the magnificent snow-capped peaks of the Buchanan Mountains. Founded 1982 by the Mill's family, it is often regarded as the **most photographed vineyard in the world**.

Here, truly great wine is produced by one of the **Central Otago viticulture pioneers**. The sense of place is also mirrored in the deep care for the environment by the Mills family.

Lake Wanaka creates a unique environment. The temperance of this large thermal mass, coupled with the protective nature of Ruby Island further softens Rippon's microclimate.

All Rippon wines are issued from a **single vineyard**; no fruit is bought in from outside the property. Rippon wines are issued from **some of the oldest vines in the region**. 80% of the vineyard is planted on its own roots and is not irrigated.

Rippon Pinot Noirs spend two winters (15-18 months, depending on vine age and vintage) in barrel and are run into bottle without filtering or fining. Rippon Pinot Noirs, Rieslings & Gewürztraminer are cellared in bottle for one year before being released to the market.

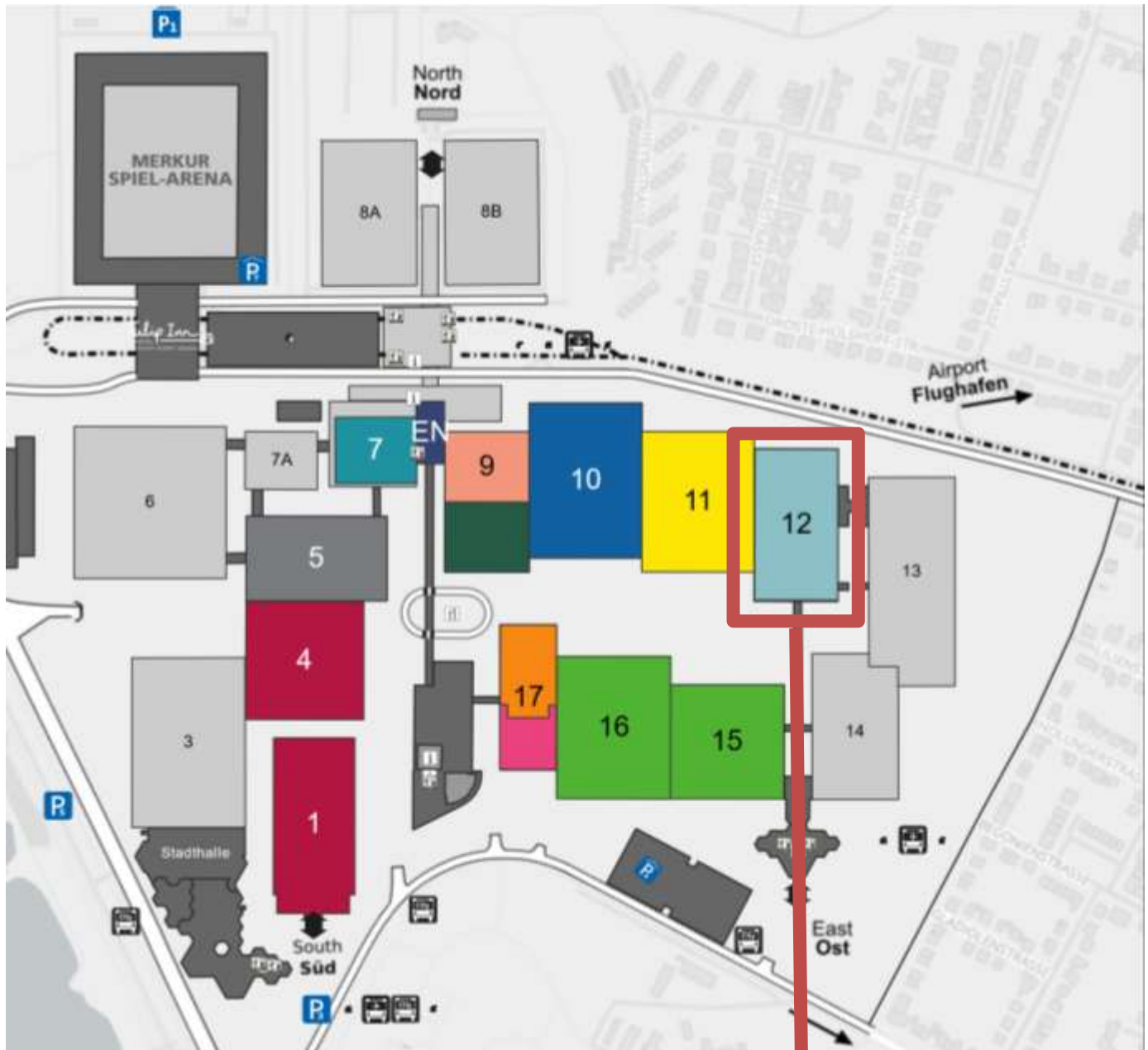

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Applicability

These general terms and conditions of purchase are applicable, to the exclusion of all other conditions, previously made undertakings and agreements, including oral agreements, to all agreements between vinabonus GmbH and 'the buyer', as well as to all legal relationships which may arise as a result of such agreements between the parties in question, unless explicitly diverged from in writing in the purchase confirmation. In these terms and conditions, the term 'buyer' may refer to any person or legal entity who/which has concluded an agreement or wishes to do so with vinabonus GmbH. The term may also refer to the latter's agent(s), authorised representative(s), legal assignee(s) and successors.

2. Quotation requests and offers

An agreement only comes about as the result of a written purchase confirmation from vinabonus GmbH.

3. Delivery and delivery costs

The delivery costs are calculated on the day of delivery. The delivery times stated by us are non-binding. We are not liable for damage if the delivery is delayed or cannot take place due to unforeseen events. If an ordered vintage is no longer available, we reserve the right to deliver an equivalent or the following year.

4. Price

Our offers are subject to change. With the publication of the valid vinabonus price list, all previous offers and price lists lose their validity. Prices given by us are per bottle excluding taxes, VAT and shipping. Prices may change with new vintages.

5. Ownership, risk

The transport risk from our warehouse is always borne by the buyer, even if the delivery is freight paid. However, we will insure the goods.

6. Claims

When the goods are delivered, please check exactly whether the shipment is complete and undamaged. Be sure to have damage and shortages acknowledged on the waybill. Only if you have damage and missing quantities immediately acknowledged on the waybill when the goods are delivered can they be asserted against the insurance company and the shipping company. Notify us in case of damage. We will work with you to settle claims. Be sure to notify us even if the delivery is delayed so that we can investigate with the carrier.

Complaints can only be considered if you notify us in writing within 8 days of receipt of the goods and if you have damage and missing quantities immediately acknowledged on the consignment note when the goods are delivered. If the complaint is justified, we have the choice to make a replacement or to issue a credit note. Further claims, especially for damages, are excluded.

We do not replace individual corked bottles. Cork defects are an unavoidable risk for which producers are also not liable. No guarantee can be given for the condition of wines older than 10 years. The crystals in the wine is not a defect.

7. Payment

The delivery is always made against prepayment.

8. Default in taking delivery

If the agreed acceptance of goods is not made on time, we have the right to withdraw from the contract without setting a subsequent deadline. The buyer bears the damage we have incurred.

9. Applicable law and disputes, partial nullity

These general terms and conditions of purchase and the agreement(s) and other agreements which are referred to therein are subject exclusively to German law. All disputes which relate to these general terms and conditions of purchase and the agreement(s), which are referred to in these conditions, will initially be presided over by the competent court in the de facto place of business of vinabonus GmbH to the exclusion of any other court. If one or more provisions of these general terms and conditions of purchase appeared to be wholly or partially invalid, they shall be interpreted in such a way that they approximate the content of those provisions as closely as possible. In such cases, the other provisions remain in full force.

The scale of prices apply to any mixed or unmixed orders as long as stock lasts. Prices might change with new vintages and until new price list is published.

All prices are net, excluding tax, duty and shipment. Shipment costs will be according to quote.

Due to distribution agreements, not all wines might be available in all countries.
